







Installing maps on your GPS

- ❑ Before you hook up the GPS to the computer using the USB cable, install the Trip & Waypoint Manager CD that comes with the unit in the box. This CD contains the drivers that allow your computer to recognize your GPS as new hardware. This CD will also install Garmin's map program, MapSource, which is the program that allows you to work with the various MapSource map sets such as Topo Canada, MetroGuide and the City Navigator series.
- ❑ It would be a good idea at this time to ensure you have the latest version of the MapSource program. It is available here: <http://www.garmin.com/support/mappingsw.jsp> and click on the MapSource link. Follow the instructions to download the update.
- ❑ If you have purchased Garmin MapSource Maps, install them on to your computer now, following the directions that come with the CDs or DVD. For most newer computers, it is easiest to load the whole map set rather than just selected locations.
- ❑ Hook up your GPS to your computer using the USB cable and turn it on.
- ❑ If you want to ensure that your GPS has the most up-to-date firmware (the internal software that runs the GPS), go to Garmin's unit update page at <http://www.garmin.com/support/blosp.jsp>, choose your GPS and follow the instructions.
- ❑ To download maps from your computer to your GPS, start the MapSource program and select the map set you want to use. (Topo Canada, MetroGuide Canada, City Navigator, etc.)
- ❑ Zoom using the zoom tool  and move, using the hand tool , to find the region on the map you want to download.
- ❑ Use the select tool  to select the areas on the map you want to put into the GPS. When the areas are selected, they will turn pink. Click "transfer" and then "send to device" to download the maps.
